Has RITA improved residents engaging in group work activity, resulting in greater stimulation and confidence?	Extremely Effective! We have a pub quiz every Tuesday and bingo on a Friday, as a group. RITA triggers group conversations where we can all reminisce together to enjoy and relate each other's memories. Small groups are able to watch films in areas where there's no TV, thus allowing us to be flexible and adapting to our residents' needs.
Has RITA helped to reduce safeguarding incidents?	Yes! If someone is watching a programme on the main TV that another person doesn't want to watchRITA allows us the option for something different to be played so it doesn't cause conflict. This is also mirrored for music choices as well.
Has RITA helped to improve Mental Health and stimulation after residents have returned from hospital?	Extremely Effective! Relaxing music is often played if someone is poorly or is on an end-of-life pathway. RITA helps to entertain and retain mental stimulus if residents aren't able to get out of their bedroom for extended periods of time.
Has engagement and interaction with family members and friends improved since using RITA by residents?	RITA opens up conversations between the residents, which they then share back with their relatives. It's really pleasant to witness when residents are able to remember what topics of conversation they've been involved with. Their ability to retain the information and share that back with relatives is really positive and constructive.
